The undersigned makes the following declarations subject to the penalty of perjury and says: That I am a peace officer with the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, Clark County, Nevada, being so employed for a period of approximately 11 year(s).

That I learned the following facts and circumstances which lead me to believe that the above named subject committed or was committing the offenses above at the location of 3400 BOULDER HWY LAS VEGAS NEVADA 89121 and that the offense(s) occurred at approximately 22:00 hours on the 25th day of February, 2020.

**Details for Probable Cause:**

On 2/26/2020 I, Detective M. Hanning P# 13733 operating as a detective with the Family Justice Center, was contacted by SGT Donelson P# 6508 reference LVMPD event number LLV200200124642. During our conversation it was discovered that SGT Donelson and SEAC patrol officers were working a domestic violence event located at 3375 Glen Ave LV, NV 89121. The details of the call were that a female had ran into the business scared and hiding from a male in a white truck bearing California plate 10594U2. Officer C. Palmira P# 13807 responded and conducted the preliminary investigation. The following is the report that he wrote:

*"On 2/26/20 at approximately 1021 hours I, Officer C. Palmira, P# 13807 (2J4), responded to a suspicious person call at 3375 Glen Ave, in Las Vegas, NV 89121. The caller stated that a scared female named Stormy, came into their office asking for police and medical, and appeared to have been battered. The caller also stated that the female advised she exited a vehicle that was parked at the Walgreen's across the street. The female also told the caller that her 15 year old daughter was in the vehicle with a male.*

*Upon my arrival with Sgt. G. Donelson, P# 6508 (544), we made contact with the occupants of a vehicle that was seen driving slow through the parking lot of the Glen address. This vehicle is described as a 2020 Chevrolet Silverado 4-door pickup truck, that is white in color. I then identified the driver via a copy of his TX identification card as Trumbull, Corey ([REDACTED] 88) and his passenger as Cline, ([REDACTED] 05). Trumbull stated that they were looking for his fiancé, Stormy. He said that they were all at the Walgreen's and that Stormy went inside to get something to drink. Trumbull said that he fell asleep and when he woke up Stormy was still gone. This Walgreen's is located across the street from the Glen address and has an address of 3400 Boulder Hwy. Trumbull said he tracked Stormy's phone to this location, but is unable to get*

further due to no longer having wife to connect. Trumbull and Cline verbally identified Stormy as, Johnson, Stormy (PII 83) and verified that she is Cline's mother. 3 dogs were also inside of the truck.

Sgt. Donelson made contact with Stormy at the Glen address and verified that she was battered. He requested medical for her and advised me over the radio that she is claiming that Trumbull caused her injuries. I then had Trumbull exit the truck so I could speak with him away from Cline. I asked Trumbull how long he and Stormy have been dating and he replied, between 7 months and a year. When asked if they have had any physical violence in the past, he stated, no. I then asked Trumbull if he noticed any injuries on Stormy prior to her leaving the truck, and he stated that she has black eyes and a busted lip. He stated that Stormy ran off and was gone for approximately 3 days. Trumbull said that Stormy called him to pick her up in the area of Tropicana and Valley View sometime around Sunday or Monday evening.

Officer J. Guerra, P# 8780 (2H4TV) then spoke with Cline to verify if Stormy had the injuries prior to today and how she obtained them. She did verify that they picked her mom (Stormy) up after she was gone for a couple of days, but could not verify what injuries she had. She also stated that she did not see her mom and Trumbull get into any physical altercation.

I then spoke with Stormy as she was inside of the ambulance. She stated that she and Trumbull have been dating for approximately one year. When asked how she obtained all of her injuries, she stated that Trumbull caused them all. Stormy could only verify the injury from today was severe pain and bruising to her upper right thigh. When asked how she got the injury, she said that Trumbull hit her with a stick, which was described as a black and red stick to Sgt. Donelson. Sgt. Donelson verified that this stick was still inside of the truck, as Cline showed it to him. I asked Stormy where Trumbull hit her with the stick and she said that it happened inside of the truck while they were in the Walgreen's parking lot. Stormy said that she was sitting in the driver's seat, as Trumbull was in the passenger seat and Cline in the rear seat. Stormy said that Trumbull hit her with the stick and told her that she better not run off again if she was to get out of the truck. Stormy was able to walk away from the truck when she noticed Trumbull sleeping, this is when she made contact with our person reporting and they in turn called police/medical for her. When Stormy showed me the injury to her upper right leg/thigh she was in visible pain and began to cry. She was then transported to the hospital to be treated for all of her injuries. Officer W. Varner, P# 6674 (2H6) followed medical to Sunrise Hospital to gather any further information and wait for detectives.

Stormy had multiple injuries to her person, all of which she stated were caused by Trumbull. She could not provide a location of where the injuries happened, only that it was in the truck and ranged from him punching her with closed fists and hitting her with the same stick as today. Stormy had the above listed injury from today, along with 2 black eyes, bleeding lower lip, bruising to her face, severe bruising to both arms, swelling to her left elbow (fractured, per medical) and swelling to her right hand (fractured finger per medical). Medical staff at Sunrise Hospital also stated that Stormy has a fractured right shoulder, nose and left pinky finger, along with swelling to her right ankle.

Based on the above circumstances and determining that Stormy and Trumbull are in a dating/domestic relationship, it was determined that a battery with a deadly weapon did occur on Stormy. This battery was described by Stormy as Trumbull hitting her multiple times on her right upper leg/thigh with a stick (weapon), causing severe pain and bruising. This weapon was contained inside of the listed truck and the truck was sealed/impounded pending a search warrant for further investigation.

Based on all of the above, Trumbull was advised that he was being arrested for the battery and I transported him to LVMPD Headquarters for further investigation by the Family Justice Detectives and other LVMPD detectives prior to booking."

Upon contacting Stormy at Sunrise Hospital, she stated that she and Corey Trumbull had been in a dating relationship for approximately seven months. They met around 7/4/2019 in Midland, TX. On or about 1/5/2020 Stormy, Corey, and [REDACTED] arrived in Las Vegas, NV after driving from Wichita Falls, TX. The three lived out of their vehicle. At this

time Corey began to get more and more violent. Stormy stated that she did not feel safe being around or leaving Corey. It should be noted that during the interview with Stormy, she was having difficulty answering questions. Additionally, she had multiple broken bones and other painful injuries.

On 2/24/20 Stormy stated that she was going to again try and escape from Corey's control. At approximately 0430 hours on 2/24/20, Corey fell asleep and Stormy ran from the truck to the 7-11 located at 5808 Boulder Hwy LV, NV 89122. Stormy was upset and crying, however, the employee of the 7-11 called police to trespass Stormy. This was documented under LVMPD event number LLV200200113747. Officer T. Hauger was contacted by Detective M. Brewer P# 7426 who questioned him reference the trespass. Officer Hauger did not observe any injuries on Stormy.

Stormy stated that after she left the 7-11 with Corey, he began to batter her. Once they returned to the truck, Corey wrapped a metal chain dog leash around Stormy's neck. The portion of the leash that hung down, was wrapped around the headrest, tying Stormy to the seat. Corey stated that this was done to keep her from running away. Stormy was told to drive and as she did, Corey would pull the leash, strangling her. Corey did this repeatedly, while Stormy drove. She drove to the Walgreens Pharmacy located at Las Vegas Blvd and Charleston, and parked. Stormy described the strangulation lasting intermittently for approximately ten minutes. She would be strangled to the point she was about to start losing consciousness and he would release the leash. Stormy stated that her throat was sore as a result of this strangulation. Additionally, she had difficulty swallowing, raspy voice, and felt sick to her stomach.

After removing the leash from around Stormy's neck, Corey began to savagely beat her entire body with his fists and a red and black pipe of stick. Corey repeatedly struck her with the pipe in the right leg to keep her from running away. Stormy also complained of a pain in her left elbow, right elbow, fingers, right ankle, lower lip, and head. Stormy stated that these injuries were caused by Corey, after event LLV200200113747.

On 2/26/2020 at approximately 0920 hours, Corey fell asleep and Stormy decided she was going to attempt to escape. She left Corey and [REDACTED] asleep in the truck in the parking lot of Walgreens located at 3400 Boulder Hwy. She snuck to the business at 3375 Glen Ave and asked them to call police. This call for police was documented above under LLV200200124642.

Stormy was transported to Sunrise Hospital where she was treated for multiple broken bones. Stormy's injuries included a broken right shoulder, broken left elbow, broken nose, broken right middle finger, broken left pinky, broken right ankle, severe pain in her head, swollen and bruised eyes, and multiple swollen bumps on her face, swollen and bleeding upper and lower lips, swollen and severely bruised right thigh, swollen and bruised right elbow. At the time of interview, she was scheduled to have multiple orthopedic surgeries to repair the broken bones. The radiologist noted that Stormy also had several other fractures that had healed.

On 2/26/2020 Officer Palmira and SGT Donelson made contact with Corey in his truck. On the driver's seat, were a dog leash and black and red stick or pipe. Corey was placed under arrest and transported to LVMPD HQ. Detective M. Brewer P# 7426 and Detective S. Giles P# 14774 conducted a recorded interview. Miranda rights at approximately 1543 hours. Corey stated that he did understand his rights and wished to continue the conversation. Corey stated that he and Stormy had been in a dating relationship for about a year. They had moved to Las Vegas recently and Stormy had been using illicit drugs.

Detective J. Fernandez P# 9843 conducted a forensic interview with [REDACTED] Cline DOB [REDACTED] PII 2005. She stated that she had been with Stormy and Corey while they were in Las Vegas. Detective Fernandez stated that [REDACTED] appeared to have been coached on what to say. When asked if Stormy had any injuries on 2/25/20 [REDACTED] stated "yes" but quickly changed her answer to "I don't know." [REDACTED] stated that it was dark and Stormy was wearing a hat. [REDACTED] also stated that Stormy was picked up by Corey on 2/23/20. [REDACTED] PRVCY

PRVCY

Due to the fact Corey battered Stormy resulting in multiple broken bones, he committed the crime of Domestic Battery Resulting in Substantial Bodily Harm.

Due to the fact Corey held Stormy captive for the period of more than 24 hours, while committing a battery that resulted in substantial bodily harm, committed the crime of kidnapping 1<sup>st</sup> degree.

Due to the fact Corey held Stormy captive and prevented her from reporting the above crimes by force, committed the crime of Coercion with Force.

Due to the fact Corey battered Stormy by placing a metal dog leash around Stormy's neck and depriving her of the ability to breathe, multiple times, committed the crime of Domestic Battery by Strangulation.

Due to the fact Corey battered Stormy by striking her in the face and body with a closed fist, committed the crime of Battery Domestic Violence 1<sup>st</sup>.
